Be a Decide to Drive Detective!

Definition: Distracted driving

Distracted driving involves any activity a person engages in that has the potential to distract him or her from the primary task of driving and increase the risk of a crash.

Have you ever seen a distracted driver behind the wheel? Maybe you have seen someone talking on a cell phone, applying makeup, drinking coffee, reaching into the back seat, or hunting for a CD? These acts, and many more, are forms of distracted driving which can be dangerous or even life-threatening.

The American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons (AAOS), Orthopaedic Trauma Association (OTA), the Chicago Automobile Trade Association and the Auto Alliance want you to learn about the dangers of distracted driving.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), in 2010 there were an estimated 3,092 fatalities in distracted driving-related crashes.





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
Roundabout Route



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Test Drive


You just received your license to drive. You need to get home. Will you be a distracted driver or will you stay focused on your driving? Let's find out if you can make it home without crashing!

<u>Directions:</u> Start at square A1. When a square has a question, select one of the two answers (in the arrows) and follow the path. The right decisions will get you home safely!




Texting Trouble

Due to a glitch in this cell phone, all of the consonants have disappeared from the text message. Can you repair the message?






